

No-swim advisory lifted for middle fork of Yuba River

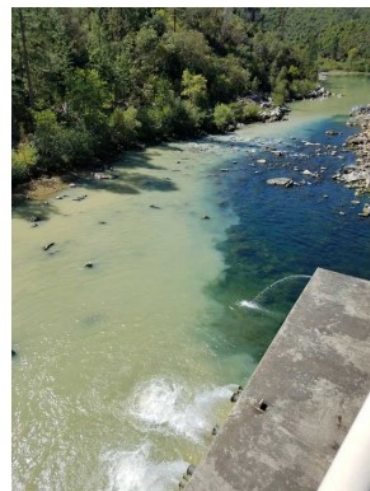


YUBA COUNTY, Calif. — The no-swim advisory for part of the middle fork of the Yuba River has been lifted, officials said Sunday evening.



Murky, yellowish water conditions seen in the water Saturday have disappeared, according to the Yuba County Office of Emergency Services.

Yuba Water Agency workers at the Colgate Power Plant discovered the discoloration.

Health officials had issued the precautionary no-swim advisory downstream from Bullards Bar Reservoir. Swimming restrictions were issued for the Rice's Crossing water access, Missouri Bar and Lower Missouri Bar.

The discoloration was similar to conditions discovered days ago along the [South Yuba River in Nevada County](#). In that case, "dangerous levels of E. coli were found," the Nevada County Office of Emergency Services said in a statement Saturday. High levels of E. coli are toxic to both humans and animals, officials said.

The no-swim advisory remains in place for the South Yuba River in Nevada County from the town of Washington to Englebright Lake.
